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SAAH 3.6.3 (SB 68)

is in his or her junior or senior year of high school and misses school for the purpose of visiting a professional at the professional's workplace for the purposes of career investigation to determine the student's interest in pursuing a career in the professional's field. Your district must not excuse for this purpose more than two days during a student's junior year and two days during a student's senior year and must adopt a policy stating when an absence will be excused for this purpose and a procedure for verifying students' visits to the professional's workplace.



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SAAH 3.6.3

Is absent as the result of a serious or life-threatening illness or related treatment that makes the student's attendance infeasible. Documentation from a health care professional licensed, certified, or registered to practice in Texas must be provided that specifies the student's illness and the anticipated period of the student's absence relating to the illness or related treatment.



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SAAH Section 3.6.3 Requirements for a Student to Be Considered Present for FSP (Funding) Purposes

Note: Documentation may be stored on paper or digitally but must be accessible for audit purposes regardless.



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SAAH Section 5.5 CTE (Contact Hour) Codes

Each CTE course must be reviewed separately to determine the average minutes per day students attend that course. **To receive CTE weighted funding, course periods must be an average of at least 45 minutes a day. LEAs that include planned early release days, pep rallies, assemblies, etc. in their calendar, must ensure that the average course length for the calendar year is at least 45 minutes. In a 10 school day period.** Three contact hours (V3) is the maximum an LEA may claim for a single course.

- On **September 1, 2023**, TEDS was updated with new guidance on how to code HOME-LANGUAGE-CODE (E0895) and STUDENT-LANGUAGE-CODE (E1590) using the new HLS.

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TEDS UPDATES – Language Guidance

HOME-LANGUAGE-CODE (E0895) indicates the languages spoken in the student’s home most-of-the-time, as determined by the student’s home language survey (19 TAC §89.1215).

The HOME-LANGUAGE-CODE is derived from the Home Language Survey question 1.

(1) “What-Which languages is-spoken-in-your-are used at home-most-of-the-time?” (E0895)

(2) “What-Which languages does-your-are used by the child speak-most-of-the-time at home?” ~~–(E1590)~~

(3) “If the child had a previous home setting, which languages were used?” If there was no previous home setting, answer Not Applicable (N/A).

The HOME-LANGUAGE-CODE is mandatory for students enrolled on the PEIMS Fall snapshot date (last Friday in October) date and/or school-start window, regardless of whether they have been determined to be Emergent Bilingual (EB). If a language other than English is spoken in the student’s home “most-of-the-time”, based on the Home Language Survey question one, then that language should be indicated by the HOME-LANGUAGE-CODE.

The HOME-LANGUAGE-CODE must be reported for the SPPI-14 collection.

STUDENT-LANGUAGE-CODE (E1590) indicates the language spoken by the student most-of-the-time, as determined by the student’s home language survey (19 TAC §89.1215).

The STUDENT-LANGUAGE-CODE is derived from the Home Language Survey questions two and three-2.

(1) “What-language-is-spoken-in-your-home-most-of-the-time?” ~~–(E0895)~~

(2) “What-Which languages does-your-are used by the child speak-most-of-the-time at home?” ~~–(E1590)~~

(3) “If the child had a previous home setting, which languages were used?” If there was no previous home setting, answer Not Applicable (N/A).

The STUDENT-LANGUAGE-CODE is mandatory for students enrolled on the PEIMS Fall snapshot date (last Friday in October) date and/or school-start window, regardless of whether they have been determined to be LEP/Emergent Bilingual (EB). If a language other than English is listed for question two or three, used by the student at home or a previous home setting spoken by the student “most-of-the-time”, based on the Home Language Survey, then that language should be indicated by the STUDENT-LANGUAGE-CODE.

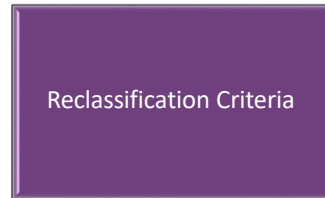
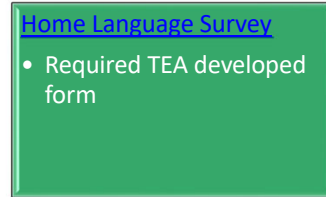
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Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 89 Revisions (August 2023)

Note: . If a school district needs one of the required letters in a language for which the agency has not yet provided a translation, LEAs should immediately contact the EB Support Division AND your ESC Representative so that the form can be officially translated. In the meantime, LEAs should use their community resources to draft a locally developed form to be used as **provisional**, while the agency obtains the appropriately translated document(s). This will create instances where the student will have **two** Home Language Surveys with **two different dates**. While this is expected to be very rare instances, the second HLS that has been translated **by the agency** will preside over the initial provisional HLS. We understand with over 1200 LEAs this will happen; however, we expect it to be minimal statewide.

The purpose of this letter is to provide guidance regarding school safety issues for educational leaders in the field and to provide updates regarding provisions of [House Bill \(HB\) 3](#) and [HB 114](#) of the 88th Regular Session, effective September 1, 2023.

Unsafe School Choice Option (USCO)

The ESSA, Title VIII, Section 8532-Unsafe School Choice Option (USCO), requires any state that receives ESSA grant funds to establish and implement a statewide policy to identify:

- Any student attending a public elementary or secondary school identified as a “persistently dangerous school (PDS)”;
- Any student who becomes a victim of a violent criminal offense while in or on the grounds of a public elementary school or secondary school that the student attends.

The policy further requires the option for these students to attend a safe public elementary school or secondary school within the local educational agency (LEA), including a public charter school.

2023-2024 Persistently Dangerous Schools Identification

For the 2023-2024 school year, using PEIMS data reported for the 2022-2023 school year, a campus will be identified as a persistently dangerous school (PDS) and required to implement the ESSA, Title VIII, Section 8532-Unsafe School Choice Option (USCO) if it meets the following criteria:

- The campus is coded as a Regular Instructional Campus in [AskTED](#); and
- Campus has reported to PEIMS in the Student Discipline Incident Association Extension Complex Type (category code 44425) that the location of the incident occurred on campus or off campus at a school-sponsored activity; and
- The campus has fewer than 200 students and has reported to PEIMS in the Student Discipline Incident Association Extension Complex Type (category code 44425) two (2) or more selected mandatory expulsion incidents in each of the three (3) most recent consecutive years for which data are available; or
- The campus has 201 or more students and has a number of mandatory expellable incidents per year equal to 1% or more of its enrollment in each of the three (3) most recent consecutive years for which data are available.

LEAs report data in the summer (PEIMS submission 3); therefore, USCO uses the three previous years’ data and not the current year’s data to make identifications. The enrollment number or student population figure is the summer PEIMS submission attendance figure, a unique count of the students served at the campus each year.

Persistently Dangerous Schools Designations:

- **Watch List for One Year's Incidents:** If a campus meets the incident rates in the definition for the most recent year, the Agency will notify the campus/LEA by letter of the watch list status.
- **Watch List for Two Years' Incidents:** If a campus meets the incident rates in the definition for the two most recent consecutive years, the Agency will notify the campus/LEA by letter of the watch list status.
- **Identified as Persistently Dangerous School:** If a campus meets the incident rates in the definition for the three most recent consecutive years, the Agency will identify the campus as persistently dangerous, as required by ESSA, and notify the campus/LEA by letter. Campus is also reported to the US Department of Education (USDE).

Persistently Dangerous Schools Designation Appeal:

If the LEA believes its designation is incorrect and wishes to appeal, the LEA must provide documentation within 21 calendar days from the initial designation notification that shows that the original PEIMS Action-Reason Codes and/or Behavior-Location Codes assigned by the LEA to the incidents at issue were incorrect. TEA will review the documentation submitted and make a determination as to whether the campus is to remain on the assigned watch list.

The PEIMS Action Reason Code 36 will remain part of the methodology for the 2023-2024 school year. If LEA designation is solely due to the use of vaping pens and LEA elects to appeal, the LEA documentation must provide documentation stating:

- the PEIMS data were coded incorrectly; or
- the incidents were due to the use of vaping pens.

2024-2025 Persistently Dangerous Schools Identification and Impact of Recent Legislation

For the 2024-2025 school year using PEIMS data reported for the 2023-2024 school year. [House Bill \(HB\) 3](#) and [HB 114](#) of the 88th Regular Session, effective September 1, 2023, are described below. The change in how these data are reported in PEIMS will assist with a decrease in the number of mandatory expulsions for felony-level drugs.

Mandatory Disciplinary Placements:

HB 114 of the 88th regular legislative session may assist with a decrease in the number of mandatory expulsions for felony-level drugs (which include marijuana and Tetrahydrocannabinols (THC) or alcohol offenses). This bill amends §37.006, Education Code (TEC), to now require mandatory disciplinary alternative education program (DAEP) placements for these offenses. Additionally, this bill requires a

student be placed in in-school suspension (ISS) when the appropriate administrator is assigning a DAEP placement for the above behaviors and the DAEP is at capacity, until a place becomes available in the DAEP or the term of the disciplinary action expires.

Out-of-School Suspension and In-School Suspension:

According to TEC, §37.005(a)-(b), the principal or other appropriate administrator may suspend a student who engages in conduct identified in the student code of conduct adopted under TEC, §37.001, as conduct for which a student may be suspended. A suspension under this section **may not exceed three school days**, with the exception of students assigned ISS due to engaging in the offenses above and DAEP being at capacity.

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Frequently Asked Questions



When loading KG assessments from the ECDS application it shows that it loaded in the ODS, but when I go into the ODS batch uploads why do I not see the Student Assessment file?

LEAs should check the File Manager in the ODS to see if the StudentAssessment or AssessmentMetadata xml files are showing an error that prevented them from being batched into the ODS uploads.



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Frequently Asked Questions



Should Local Education Agencies (LEAs) report all prekindergarten (PK) and kindergarten (KG) students enrolled at any time before the Early Childhood Data System (ECDS) Collections, even if they are not assessed?

LEAs should report all KG and PK students in their respective ECDS Collections that were enrolled at any time before the collection due date, regardless if the student was assessed. In addition, LEAs should be verifying through their business validations and reports if a KG or PK student that is reported should have a TEA Commissioner approved assessment. For the ECDS KG and PK submissions all students that are promoted will show on the ECD0-000-004 KG Data Submission Report or ECD0-000-006 PK Data Submission Report. Those KG students that are submitted without an assessment will display demographics, course/section, special programs information and show as 'Not Assessed' for their assessment information on the report. Those PK students that are submitted without an assessment will display demographics, course/section, special programs information and show as 'Null' for their assessment information. In addition, a special warning business validation should also be triggered indicating the ECDS KG or PK student should have assessment data information reported.

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SB 1888 – Texas First Early High School Completion

SB 1888 amended TEC §28.0253, by removing “pilot” from the Texas First Early High School Completion Program. This program allows public high school students who demonstrate early readiness for college to graduate early from high school. A student who earns a high school diploma through this program is considered to have earned a distinguished level of achievement under the foundation high school program.

Initially, TEA added one new data element, TEXAS-FIRST-EARLY-HIGH-SCHOOL-COMPLETION-PROGRAM (E1736) and a corresponding code table. In TEDS version 2024.2.1, TEA added one new GRADUATION-TYPE-CODE (E0806/C062).

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HB 114 amends TEC §37.006 to direct a mandatory disciplinary alternative education program (DAEP) placement for a student observed possessing, using, being under the influence, selling, giving, or delivering to another person marihuana or tetrahydrocannabinol on or within 300 feet of school property or while attending a school-sponsored or school-related activity on or off of school property. Additionally, the bill directs a mandatory DAEP placement for a student observed possessing, using, selling, giving, or delivering to another person an e-cigarette.

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HB 8 – PEIMS Associate Degree Indicator

HB 8 amends TEC §29.908(b). A participating student can complete high school and enroll in a program at an institution of higher education that will enable the student to, on or before the fifth anniversary of the date of the student’s first day of high school, receive a high school diploma and either: (A) an applied associate degree, or (B) an academic associate degree.

ASSOCIATE-DEGREE-INDICATOR-CODE (E1696) indicates that the student earned an associate degree by August 31, immediately following graduation.

An associate degree is defined as an award that normally requires at least 2 but less than 4 years of full-time equivalent college work in a grouping of courses designed to lead the individual directly to employment in a specific career or to transfer to an upper-level baccalaureate program. This specifically refers to the associate of arts, associate of science, associate of applied arts, associate of applied science, associate of arts in teaching, and associate of occupational studies degrees. The term "applied" in an associate degree name indicates a program in which the content is primarily technical. (Source: Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board Glossary of Terms)

For the 2023-2024 PEIMS Fall Submission (1):

Local education agencies (LEAs) should report the associate degree earned by a graduate (if not previously reported) from the 2022-2023 school year using the PARTICIPATION-INDICATOR-CODE (C088) table.

For the 2023-2024 PEIMS Summer Submission (3):

LEAs should report the associate degree earned at any point in the 2023-2024 school year by a student in 11th or 12th grade using the ASSOCIATE-DEGREE-INDICATOR (C235) table.

For the 2024-2025 PEIMS Fall Submissions and after:

The district where the student received the associate degree will be the district to report this information using the ASSOCIATE-DEGREE-INDICATOR (C235) table. Schools should not wait to report the associate degree information at the point of graduation if the student earns the associate degree prior to graduation. It should be reported in the next PEIMS Submission after the degree is earned.

A student may be reported as having earned an associate degree at any point while in 11th or 12th grade or by August 31 immediately following graduation.

- A local school district or open-enrollment charter school policy will determine if a parent can request a student repeat a high school credit course for a higher grade. (See TEC §§28.02124(a-1) and 28.02124(g))
- If a parent requests a student repeat a course for high school credit under TEC §28.02124, the time that the student spends taking the course for a subsequent time **does** count towards the accumulation of attendance hours for FSP funding purposes.
- A student repeating one high school credit course is not at-risk. Students in grades 1-8 would be coded at-risk if not advanced from one grade to the next at the request of a parent.
- A parent can enroll a five-year-old student in prekindergarten if the student would have been eligible to enroll in prekindergarten during the previous school year under TEC §29.153(b) and the student has not yet enrolled in kindergarten.

HB 1416 – TReX Accelerated Instruction

HB 1416 amends TEC §28.0211 related to accelerated and supplemental instruction for students. Each student that fails to achieve at least satisfactory performance on each assessment instrument administered under TEC §39.023 must be provided supplemental instruction for no less than 15 hours or 30 hours for a student whose performance on the applicable assessment instrument was significantly below satisfactory, as defined by commissioner rule.

TEA added five new data elements and two new code tables to the Texas Records Exchange (TReX) to allow an LEA to transfer information about the accelerated learning plan developed and completed for a student.

HB 3 amends TEC §25.002(a) to include in the documents required to be transferred when a student moves from one school to a new school a copy of the child’s disciplinary record and any threat assessment involving the child’s behavior under §37.115.

TEA is developing a method in TReX to automatically transfer prior year discipline records using the PEIMS Summer discipline records. LEAs will also need to send threat assessment information and current year discipline records from one LEA to a new LEA at the time of a student’s transfer. TEA has added 11 new, revised three existing and deleted one data element. TEA has also added two new code tables.

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HB 4375 – TReX Automated External Defibrillator Instruction

HB 4375 amends TEC §28.0023 to add instruction in the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED) to the existing required instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation techniques for students in grades seven through twelve.

AED training will be added to the existing CPR training. TEA will add this requirement to the existing CPR-INSTRUCTION-MET-DATE (TE122) in TReX.
Pending rule development.



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HB 1416 – PEIMS Accelerated Instruction

HB 1416 amends TEC §28.0211 related to accelerated and supplemental instruction for students. Each student that fails to achieve at least satisfactory performance on each assessment instrument administered under TEC §39.023 must be provided supplemental instruction for no less than 15 hours or 30 hours for a student whose performance on the applicable assessment instrument was significantly below satisfactory, as defined by commissioner rule. The agency shall monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the accelerated instruction required under this section.

TEA has published an [early notice](#) on September 1, 2023, with the information on collecting new data elements in the 2024-2025 PEIMS Summer Submission.



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HB 2209 – PEIMS Rural Pathway Excellence Partnership

HB 2209 adds the Rural Pathway Excellence Partnership (R-PEP), which allows rural school districts to enter into agreements with other school districts to develop rural college and career pathway partnerships. The funding for the program comes from the Foundation School Program and provides for outcomes bonuses based on a student from the program obtaining not later than five years after high school graduation a postsecondary credential of value.

TEA is working to determine what will be needed to implement this bill during the 2024-2025 school year.



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SB 1647 amends TEC §29.081 to allow an LEA to operate a dropout recovery program using an education management organization in addition to methods that are currently used. The bill outlines the requirements for teachers and how the program is offered (remote, hybrid, in-person). The bill also outlines new requirements for these dropout recovery programs, which would provide an attendance rate for students who successfully complete a course offered through the program.

TEA is working to determine what will be needed to implement this bill during the 2024-2025 school year.
