Within 30 days following the date of the opening Region 16 ESC staff will evaluate each proposal submitted. Region 16 ESC reserves the right to accept or reject any and all proposals and waive any formalities.

Prospective vendors and/or their agents shall undertake no activity, action, or contact to promote or advertise their responses to the Region 16 ESC Board of Directors or any Region 16 ESC employee. Violation of this provision will be grounds for disqualification of the vendor.

# **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

- 1. The intended Agreement will become effective July 1, 2024 and will remain in effect for one calendar year. Region 16 ESC reserves the right to extend the Agreement up to an additional thirty-six (36) months in twelve-month increments with all terms and conditions remaining firm.
- 2. Region 16 ESC reserves the right to reject any and all proposals or parts of a proposal and waive technicalities, and to adjust quantities.

# **KEY DECISION CRITERIA**

Pursuant to Section 44.031 of the Texas Education Code, Region 16 ESC may consider the following in determining to whom to award this contract:

- 1. The purchase price; 50%
- 2. The reputation of the vendor and of the vendor's goods or services; 10%
- 3. The quality of the vendor's goods or services; 10%
- 4. The extent to which the goods or services meet Region 16 ESC's needs; 10%
- 5. The vendor's past relationship with Region 16 ESC; 5%
- 6. The impact on the ability of Region 16 ESC to comply with laws and rules relating to historically underutilized businesses; 5%

# SB 9 CONTRACTOR CERTIFICATION: CONTRACTOR EMPLOYEES (AS APPLICABLE)

Texas Education Code Chapter 22 requires entities that contract with school districts to obtain criminal history records on covered employees. Covered employees with disqualifying criminal histories are prohibited from serving at a school district. Contractors must certify to Region 16 ESC that they have complied and must obtain similar certifications from their subcontractors. The law requires each contractor to obtain the criminal histories of its covered employees. # Definitions:

Covered employees: Employees of a contractor who have or will have continuing duties related to the service to be performed at a school district and have or will have direct contact with students. Region 16 ESC will be the final arbiter of what constitutes continuing duties and direct contact with students.

Disqualifying criminal history: (1) a conviction or other criminal history information designated by Region 16 ESC; (2) a felony or misdemeanor offense that would prevent a person from being employed under Texas Education Code § 22.085(a), that is: if at the time of the offense, the victim was under 18 or was enrolled in a public school: (a) a felony offense under Title 5, Texas Penal Code; (b) an offense on conviction for which a defendant is required to register as a sex offender under Chapter 62, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure; or (c) an offense under federal law or the laws of another state that is equivalent to (a) or (b).

## **SB 252 CERTIFICATION**
