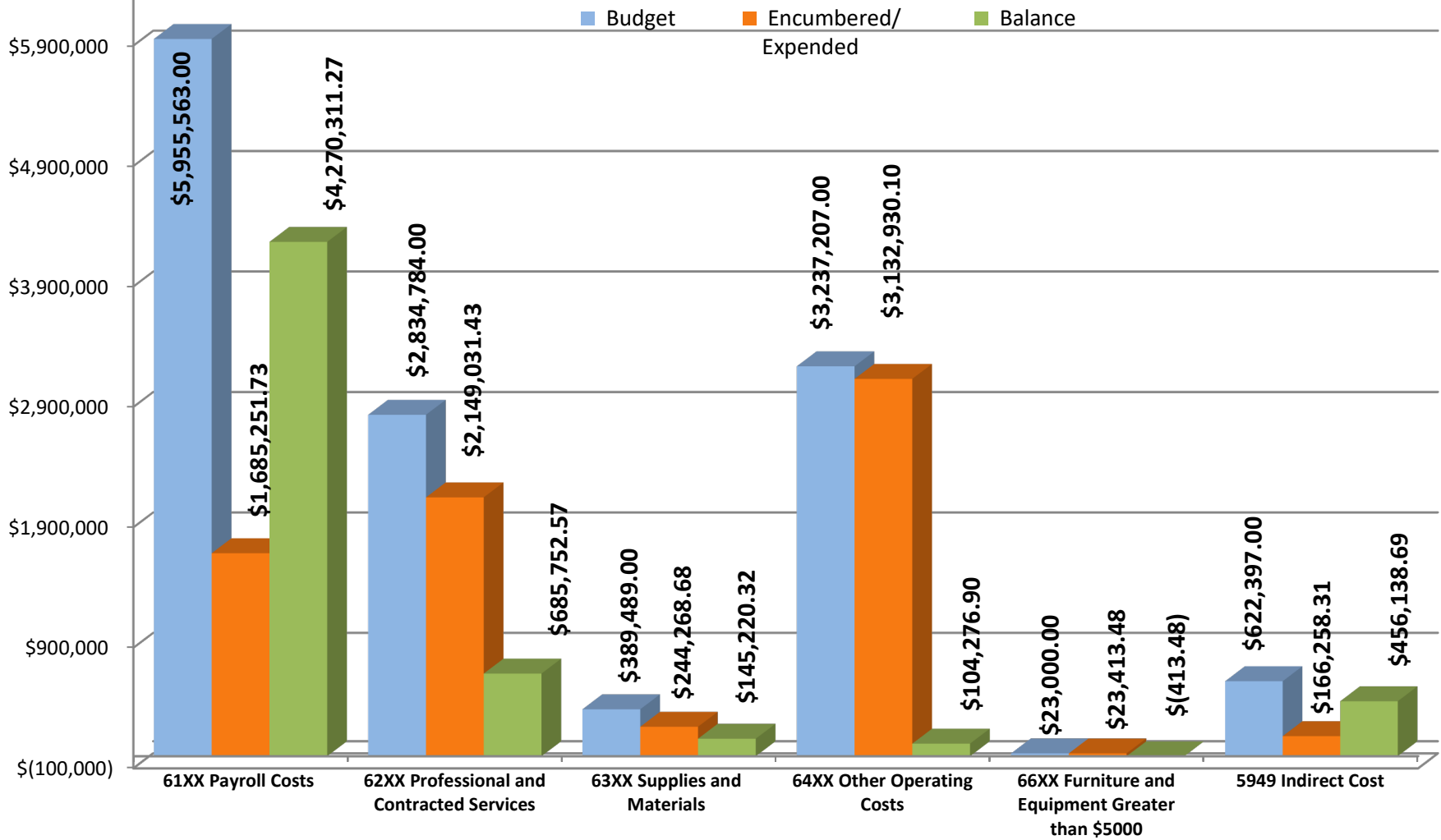


Head Start/Early Head Start Program Monthly Program Summary

Early Head Start Education: Trained 9 directors and 4 Early Head Start staff in Administration of Creative Curriculum fidelity tool; trained 37 experienced teachers in Creative Curriculum fidelity tool; trained 51 Early Head Start staff in Conscious Discipline; trained 3 Early Head Start staff as trainer of trainers in infant/toddler Circle Engage through Children’s Learning Institute.		
Head Start Education: Conducted cluster training for 47 regional classroom instructional assistants; conducted Classrooms Assessment Scoring System observations, 8 new Head Start teachers; assisted 4 teachers in completion of their Children’s Learning Institute.		
Family Services: Trained 249 parents in Planning Your Safe Place Conscious Discipline Parent Education; connected 55 children with warm coats in Amarillo area; completed Baby Basics prenatal training for 6 Home Educators; facilitated first Policy Council meeting with twelve representatives present.		
Health: Conducted Health Advisory Council (32 members, 24 non employees); attended Healthy Workplace training (2 staff members); provided 90 day screenings 16 sites totaling 979 children; provided dental exams for 8 sites totaling 650 children.		
Mental Wellness: Conducted “Conscious Discipline Refresher” for 5 teachers at Pampa Lamar; presented “Making Bedtime Easier” to 3 families and 1 teacher at Paramount Terrace Elementary Parent Night; attended Counselor Ethics Training refresher course (3 staff members).		
Nutrition: Coordinated Head Start Fair for 127 participants and 28 community agencies; provided nutrition classes for 42 parents and 26 children at 4 Head Start sites; conducted annual Child and Adult Care Food Program training for 6 administrative and 7 kitchen staff; completed initial height at weight screening for 27 Early Head Start and 75 Head Start children.
