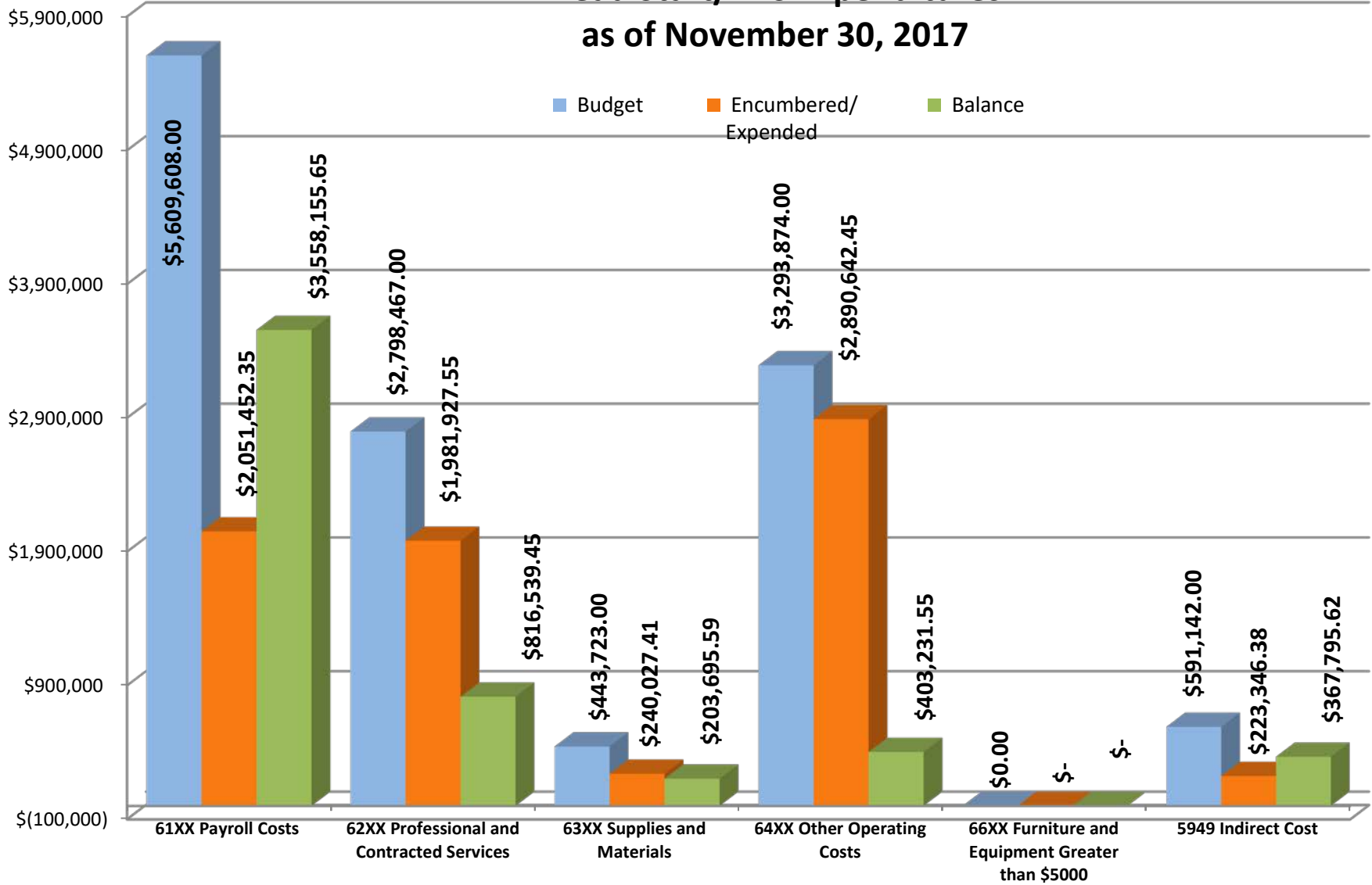


## Head Start/Early Head Start Program Monthly Program Summary

**November 2017**

<p><i>Head Start Education:</i> Provided cluster training to 49 Head Start teachers; attended NAEYC 3 staff; began Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) observations for Head Start teachers at Cleveland and Nelson Centers; assisted 62 teachers with Brigance scores, Children’s Learning Institute (CLI) assessments, and entering data in Child Plus.</p>		
<p><i>Early Head Start Education:</i> Completed Infant/Toddler Environmental Rating Scale (ITERS-R) observations for 8 Early Head Start classrooms; 7 home-educators and 5 parents attended a parent read-aloud session; 10 Directors attended an ITERS-R reliability training session; distributed training materials and resources to 12 centers for ITERS-R observation training for 35 classrooms and more than 80 Early Head Start staff members.</p>		
<p><i>Family Services:</i> Provided leadership and meeting protocol training to 3 Policy Council Officers; facilitated Policy Council Meeting for 10 Parents and 2 Community Representatives; hosted clothing swap with 2500 pieces of clothing donated by Head Start/Early Head Start parents, 40 families received clothing and 12 community volunteers assisted; visited 7 community service providers with 10 family service staff members for training.</p>		
<p><i>Health:</i> Arranged school dental clinics screening 200 Head Start/Early Head Start students; completed 45- &amp; 90-day screenings on 35 Early Head Start and 311 Head Start students; visited 4 pregnant mothers; taught poison control at in-home visit; provided training on medication administration at Little Nest 6 staff members; assisted families with counseling services.</p>		
<p><i>Mental Wellness:</i> Initial student support team meetings; assisting with Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) observations; begin follow-up on missing/overdue social emotional screening forms.</p>		
<p><i>Nutrition:</i> Completed height and weight assessments on 29 Early Head Start and 39 Head Start students; provided updated Child and Adult Care Food Program training to 12 Early Head Start staff members; conducted Group Socialization Activity/Parent meetings for 10 Early Head Start parents in Dimmitt and Borger; assisted Family Service Assistant’s at 15 sites to complete appropriate referrals and documentation for nutrition services.</p>
