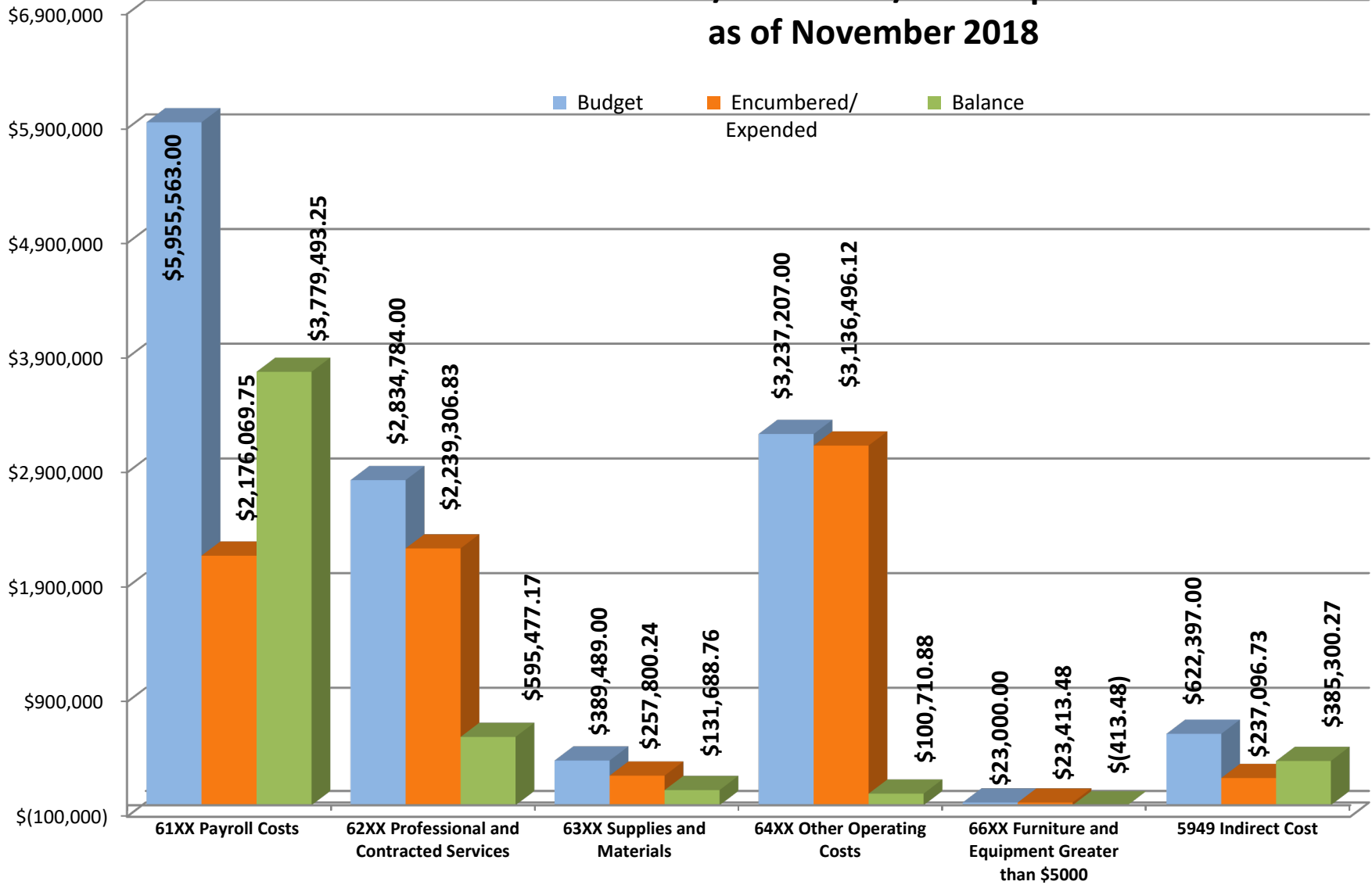


## Head Start/Early Head Start Program Monthly Program Summary

**November 2018**

<p><b>Early Head Start Education:</b> Coordinated training for Early Head Start Directors (10) and teachers (15) in the importance of male involvement in the role of language acquisition and literacy, teachers (25) also attended Conscious Discipline Training; reliability certification in Toddler Classroom Assessment Scoring System was achieved by 12 Early Head Start center administrators; completed the translation of books for Burmese clientele.</p>		
<p><b>Head Start Education:</b> Conducted cluster training on phonological awareness and toxic stress - 41 Head Start teachers; conducted Class Assessment Scoring System trainings (2) new Head Start teachers; conducted Classroom Assistance Scorings System observations (2) new Head Start teachers.</p>		
<p><b>Family Services:</b> Hired Early Head Start Home Educator for Borger families; hosted parents as teachers regional training for 16 home-based staff; completed home visit rating scale observations for 8 home base staff; presented Conscious Discipline parent curriculum <i>Empathy</i> to 271 parents at 21 Head Start sites; presented a family story telling night with a make and take event focusing on male involvement that 21 males attended and 42 families; trained 3 policy council officers regarding meeting protocol and procedures.</p>		
<p><b>Health:</b> Attended West Texas health managers meeting; attended Amarillo college dental advisory meeting as a community partner; attended network 4 kids meeting; attended managing comprehensive health services training; attended child plus training for data alignment.</p>		
<p><b>Mental Wellness:</b> Supported male involvement training for 42 families/21 males; redistributed EHS mental health sites to begin serving in December; attended child plus training for data alignment; observed 17 sites supporting 1159 Head Start students.</p>		
<p><b>Nutrition:</b> Attended "Managing Comprehensive Health Services" training; assisted new Early Head Start site with U.S. Department of Agriculture nutrition requirements and recommendations; completed height and weight screening for 17 Early Head Start children and 31 Head Start children.</p>
