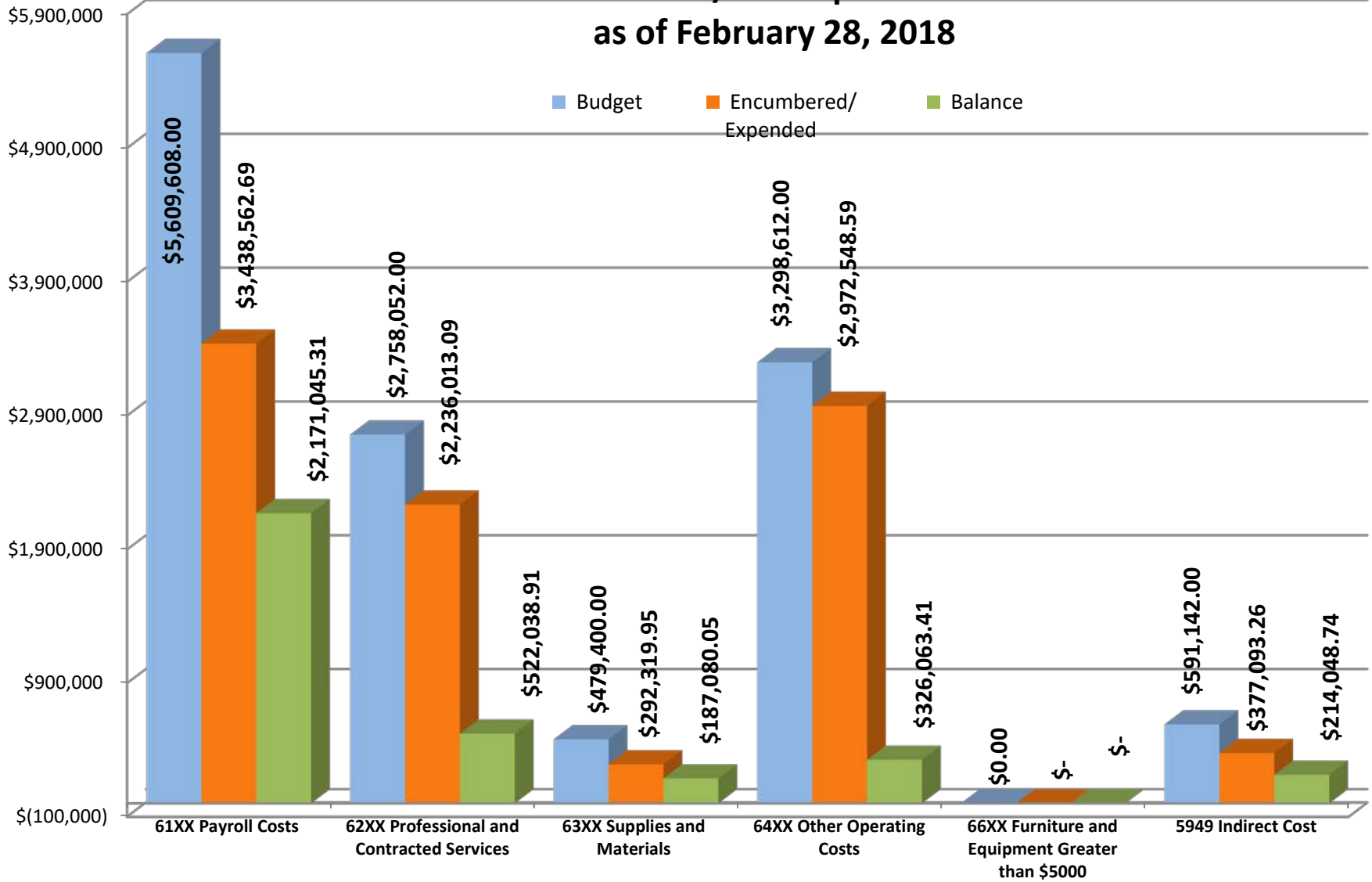


## Head Start/Early Head Start Program Monthly Program Summary

<p><i>Early Head Start Education:</i> Conducted transition training for 13 home-based staff, 27 teachers/instructional assistants, 4 principals/directors, 2 family services staff, &amp; 3 health staff; attended Poverty Institute-Dr. Donna Beegle-4 Early Head Start staff; completed individual staffing for 52 Early Head Start children &amp; families</p>		
<p><i>Head Start Education:</i> Provided training for 7 teachers at Second Year Teacher Academy; provided support for Children’s Learning Institute Engage for 63 classrooms; provided information on Children’s Learning Institute Engage and the school readiness goals to 15 attendees at the School Readiness Committee. 18 instructional assistants and 2 teachers attended the CIRCLE Training with Texas School Year for 14 hours of professional development hours for Cleveland and Nelson Centers. Provided professional development on disabilities, trauma, and student identification to 42 Head Start Teacher/Early Head Start teachers/Instructional Assistants/Family Service Assistants that are center based with Cleveland and Nelson and 2 Family Service Specialist and 1 Mental Wellness Specialist that are regional through the STAR Kids program with Medicaid. Conducted 363 parent conference to update parents on child progress for Cleveland and Nelson Centers.</p>		
<p><i>Family Services:</i> Initiated Family Service Credential training to Head Start, Early Head Start, and Community Family Service staff; attended Poverty Institute - 11 staff; attended Poverty Coaching Institute – 1 staff; provided attendance training to 19 staff; provided budgeting training to 14 parents at the Cleveland Center.</p>		
<p><i>Health:</i> Completed assessments on 35 Early Head Start and 95 Head Start children; attended Poverty training-nursing staff; attended networking for kids-2 RN’s; completed allergy training for all Head Start direct care staff; attended school nurse conference and legal notes conference call for school nurses.</p>		
<p><i>Mental Wellness:</i> Conducted “Fathers and Mothers Matter” training for Policy Council members; began initial planning for mental wellness policies and processes for next school year.</p>		
<p><i>Nutrition:</i> Monitored Cleveland and Nelson centers for Child and Adult Care Food Program compliance; completed Master Wellness Volunteer Training through Agri-Life Extension; completed height and weight assessments for 190 Early Head Start and 21 Head Start children.</p>
