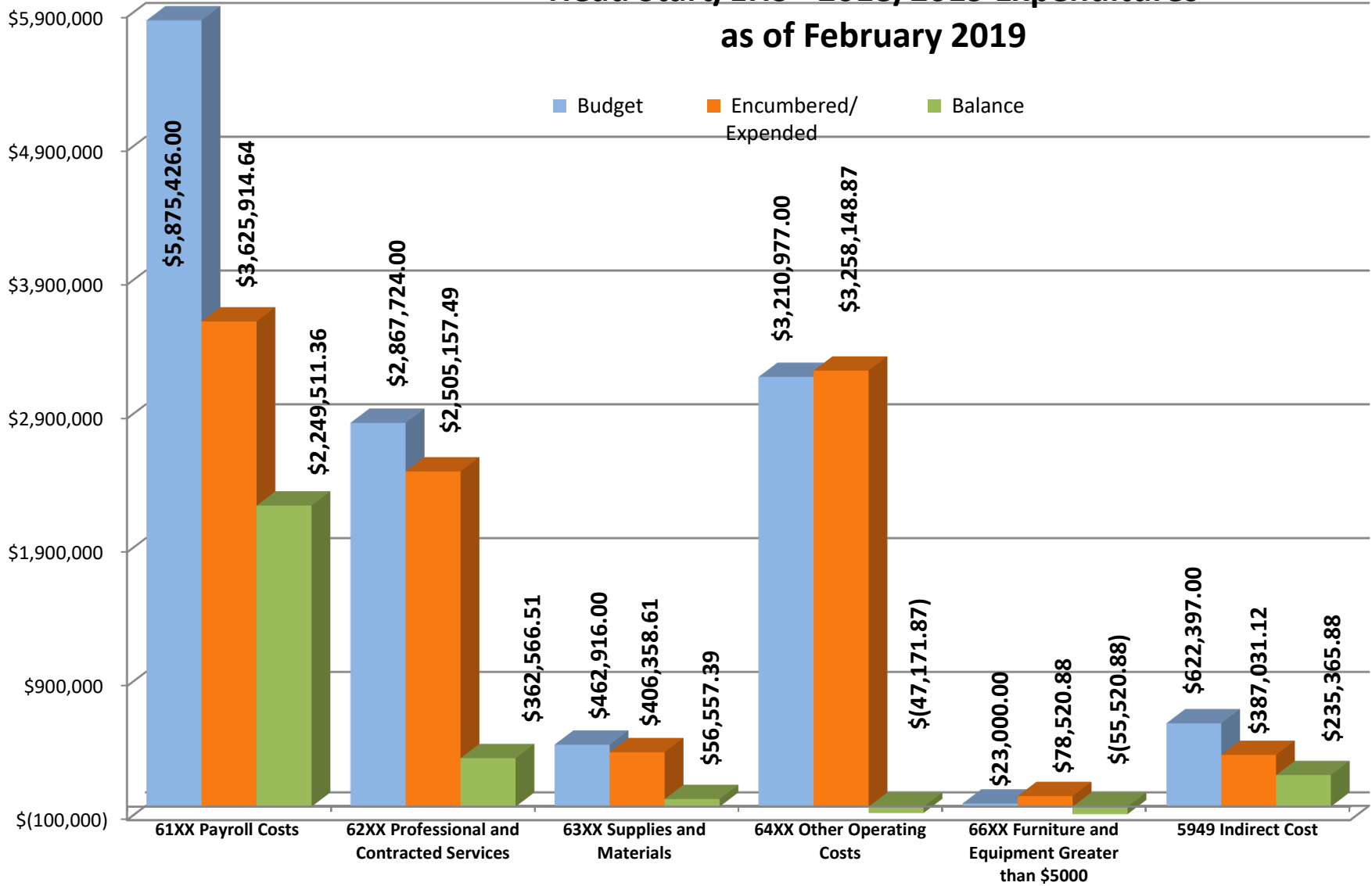


Head Start/Early Head Start Program Monthly Program Summary

February 2019

<i>Enrollment:</i>	Head Start: 1,365 (Funded 1,341)	Early Head Start: 432 (Funded 422)
<i>Attendance (January)</i>	Head Start: 88.94%	Early Head Start: 84.12%
<i>In-Kind (January):</i>	Head Start: \$ 281,395.40	Early Head Start: \$ 50,492.24
<i>In-Kind (Cumulative (7/1/18-1/31/19):</i>	Head Start: \$ 1,711,143.93	Early Head Start: \$ 480,243.64
<i>Early Head Start Education:</i> Provided lesson planning training for 42 teachers; provided Conscious Discipline Baby Doll Circle Time training-53 staff; provided toddler Classroom Assessment Scoring Scale training-48 teachers.		
<i>Head Start Education:</i> Trained Second Year Teacher Academy-8 teachers; attended Teachstone Coaching training-4 Education Specialists; scheduled 21 trainings for the 2019-2020 school year.		
<i>Family Services:</i> Provided transition training to Family Services Assistants at all sites; completed days 3 and 4 of Family Service Credential training to 7 Head Start staff, 8 Early Head Start staff, and 8 family services workers from agencies in Amarillo, Lubbock, and Snyder; facilitated Policy Council- 4 Community Representatives and 7 Parent Representatives present; offered Conscious Discipline mini-session training over Noticing to parents at all Head Start sites.		
<i>Health:</i> Conducted a Friends and Family CPR class for 10 parents from Sundown and Lakeview; attended a school nurse conference; performed health screenings for 87 Head Start/Early Head Start children; attended 9 medical appointments with Head Start children and their families; performed nursing assessments on 8 pregnant women.		
<i>Mental Wellness:</i> Presented "Living Well: Wellness Wheel" training for 17 staff members; evaluated Brigance versus Devereux eDECA for social-emotional-behavioral screening for next school year in Head Start; served approximately 40 students with observation or follow-up.		
<i>Nutrition:</i> Attended Child and Adult Care Food Program conference in Georgetown; monitored Cleveland and Nelson Centers for Child and Adult Care Food Program compliance; presented and obtained approval for nutrition policy changes from 7 parents and 4 community members during Policy Council meeting; completed 146 height and weight assessments for Early Head Start children.
