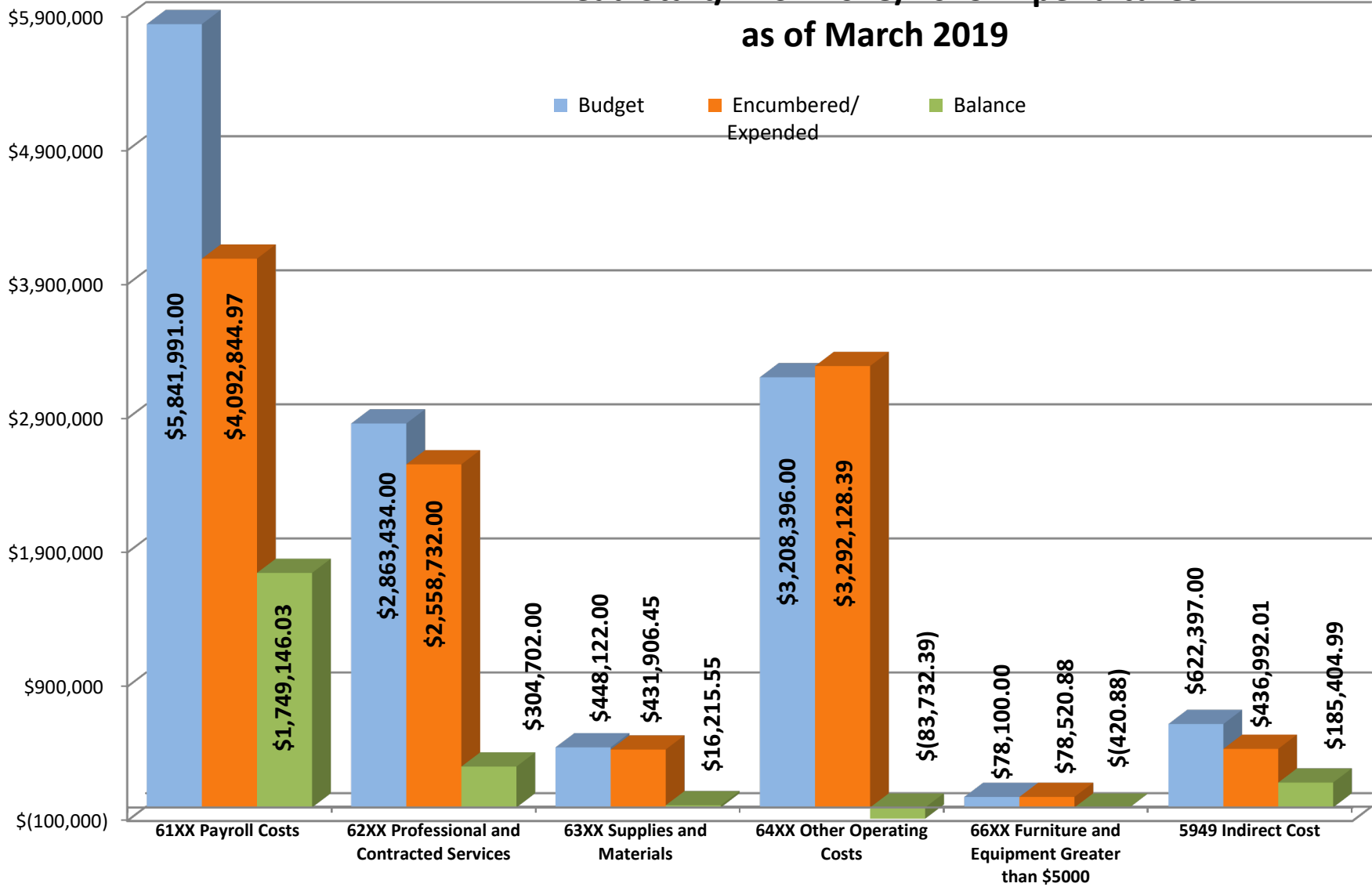


## Head Start/Early Head Start Program Monthly Program Summary

**March 2019**

<i>Enrollment:</i>	Head Start: 1,358 (Funded 1,341)	Early Head Start: 425 (Funded 422)
<i>Attendance (February)</i>	Head Start: 88.71%	Early Head Start: 86.32%
<i>In-Kind (February):</i>	Head Start: \$306,119.19	Early Head Start: \$59,693.90
<i>In-Kind (Cumulative (7/1/18-2/28/19):</i>	Head Start: \$2,017,264.92	Early Head Start: \$538,812.54
<i>Early Head Start Education:</i> Completed child information checks for 273 children; completed 1 Infant Class Assessment Scoring System observation; provided Conscious Discipline training for 10 Early Head Start staff.		
<i>Head Start Education:</i> Conducted training for 6 new Head Start teachers; conducted transition training for 49 Head Start teachers; completed consumable supply orders for 51 regional Head Start teachers.		
<i>Family Services:</i> Completed days 5 and 6 of Family Service Credential training for 7 Head Start staff, 8 Early Head Start staff, and 8 family services workers from agencies in Amarillo, Lubbock, and Snyder; 2 family service staff attended a community services tour focused on helping people with addiction issues; attended community assessment meetings at Regence Health Network and AgriLife to determine ongoing services for homeless and/or low-income families.		
<i>Health:</i> Assisted with height and weights for 1,253 Head Start children; attended 17 medical appointments with Head Start children and families; made five referrals to hearing and vision specialists for Head Start and Early Head Start children; assessed 10 pregnant women.		
<i>Mental Wellness:</i> Participated in independent school district staffing for three students with ongoing behavioral needs; began reviewing and updating mental wellness policies and procedures.		
<i>Nutrition:</i> Completed height and weight assessments for 1,253 Head Start children; updated policy for Policy Council approval; completed height and weight assessments for 42 Early Head Start children.		
<i>USDA Meal Counts (February):</i> Breakfast 17,295; Lunch 19,913; Snack 7,421
