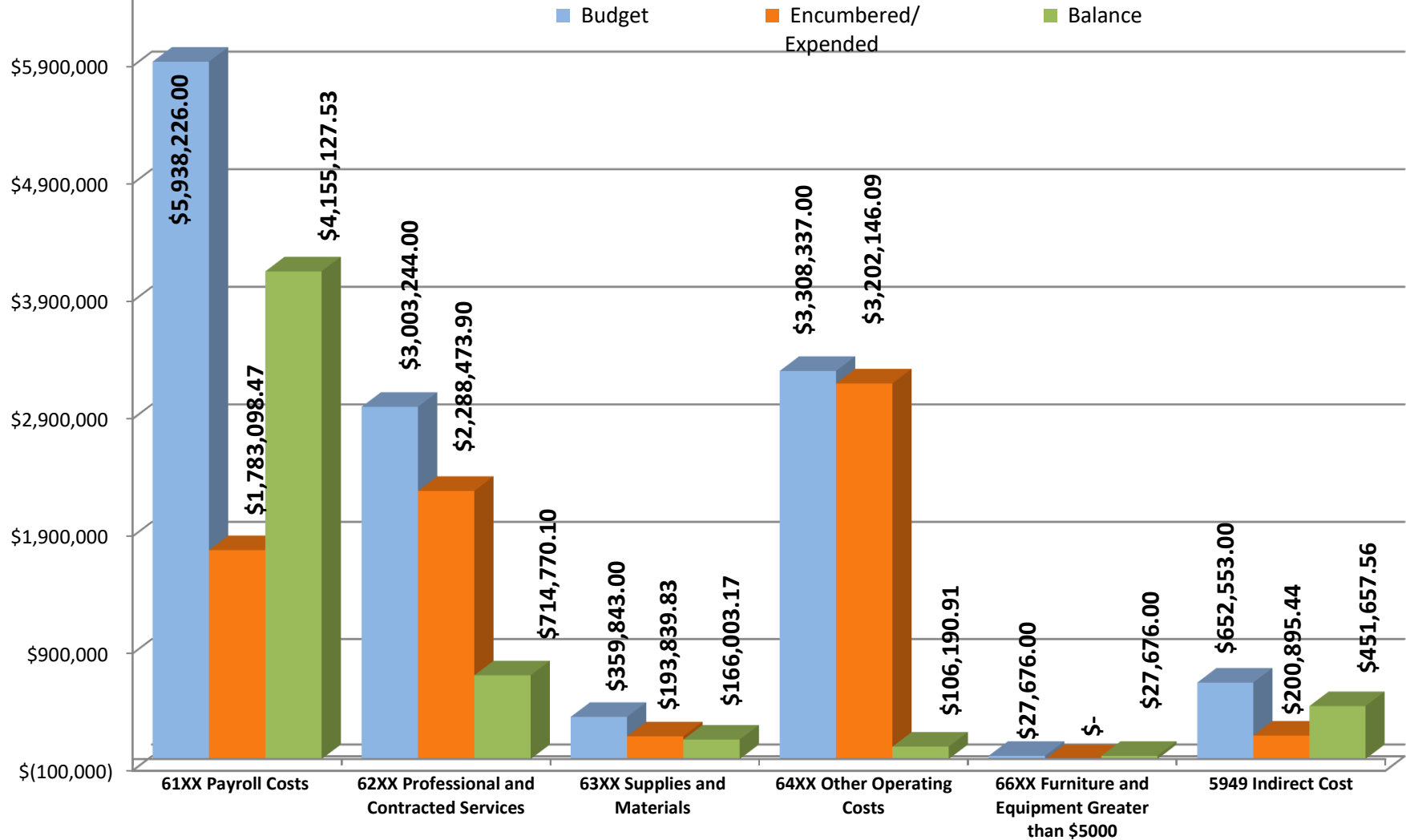


## Head Start/Early Head Start Program Monthly Program Summary

**October 2019**

<b>Early Head Start Education:</b> Approved 15 HB staff to attend Parents As Teachers Regional training; provided Curriculum Fidelity Training for 16 EHS teachers/assistants and 1 director; completed ITERS-3 (Infant Toddler Environmental Rating Scale 3) observations for 26 classrooms		
<b>Head Start Education:</b> conducted training for 42 instructional assistants; conducted 19 CLASS observations for new teachers or those that fell below the national average; followed up on students whose Brigance scores rated them "at-risk".		
<b>Family Services:</b> Conducted elections to select 12 Parent Representatives for Policy Council; provided Parent Leadership Training to 35 staff and 28 parents; trained 28 family service staff over Conscious Discipline mini-session curriculum; facilitated first Policy Council meeting of the year for 4 Community Representatives and 11 Parent Representatives.		
<b>Health:</b> Performed over 500 dental exams for Head Start and Early Head Start children; assessed lead and Hemoglobin levels for 375 children throughout the region; conducted vision and hearing rescreens on 48 Head Start Children; performed assessments on 6 pregnant women, and attended 3 Developmental pediatrician appointments for Head Start children.		
<b>Mental Wellness:</b> Conducted "Conscious Discipline Kick-Off" meeting for 12 parents and 2 teachers at Dumas Morningside; attended "Child Abuse & Grief" workshop and "Counselor's Ethics" training (1 staff member).		
<b>Nutrition:</b> Coordinated Family Fair for 160 participants and 32 community agencies; mentored 2 dietetic interns from TTU for one week each; attended CACFP Administrative Review Prep training.		
<i>USDA Meal Counts: (September)</i> Breakfast 19,067; Lunch 20,319; Snack 7,234
