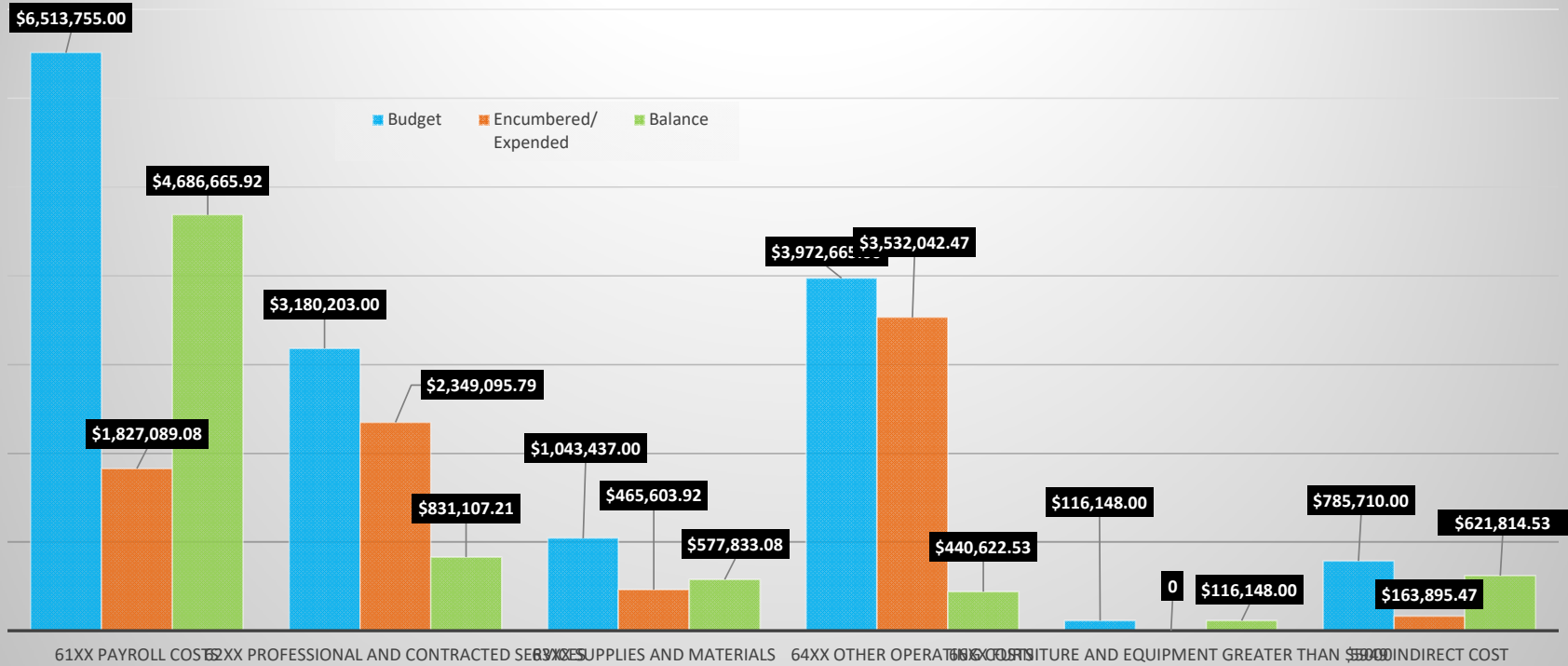


Head Start/Early Head Start Program Monthly Program Summary

<p>Early Head Start Education: Provided Cognitive Development Aligned with Head Start Early Learning Outcomes Framework for 30 Early Head Start staff; provided Conscious Discipline Built for Connection training for 9 Early Head Start staff; Education Coordinator, Early Head Start Coordinated Services Specialist, Administrative Assistant, 2 Coaches, and Early Head Start Home-Based Coordinated Services Specialist attended Zero to Three Annual Conference, virtually</p>		
<p>Head Start Education: Completed the Brigance screener for students in 67 Head Start classrooms; started the Children’s Learning Institute Beginning of Year assessment on all Head Start students; provided training for 130 teachers and classroom assistants through a newsletter called <u>The Coffee Shop Chat</u></p>		
<p>Family Services: Provided Conscious Discipline training for parents/caregivers virtually and in 5 languages to 26 Head Start sites; received training from the National Association of Social Workers-Texas Chapter for 2 Family Service Specialists; helped plan and facilitate Policy Council for 7 Parent Representatives and 1 Community Representative; continued Family Services Credential training for 11 staff.</p>		
<p>Health: Performed health screenings on 179 Head Start children and 26 Early Head Start students; assisted dentist with 450 visual dental exams; connected 6 Head Start families with transportation to medical and dental appointments through a partnership with Panhandle Community Services.</p>		
<p>Mental Wellness: Participated in virtual counselor ethics training; developed article for “Head Start Staff Wellness” virtual newsletter; provided mental wellness tip link (English and Spanish) for families being served virtually; provided site visits/observations as allowed under pandemic restrictions to approximately 50% of sites.</p>		
<p>Nutrition: Completed initial height and weight screening for 179 Head Start and 26 Early Head Start students. Developed dental information for newsletter with assistance from Dietetic Intern; attended CACFP Summit and Virtual Academy; participated in national conference for Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, including updated information on COVID-19 .</p>
